




SUMMER FISHING TRIP

FAMOUS SEPTEMBER MASON

RICHARD I, KING OF ENGLAND

Duke of Normandy, Aquitaine and Gascony; Lord of Cyprus; Count of Poitiers, Anjou, Maine and Nantes; Overlord of Brittany

Best known as Richard the Lionheart and Richard Cœur de Lion

September 8, 1157, Beaumont Palace, Oxford, England - April 6, 1199, Châlus, Duchy of Aquitaine (Buried at Fontevraud Abbey, Anjou, France; his heart entombed at Rouen Cathedral, France, and his viscera in Châlus, France, where he died.)

We, however, place the love of God and His honor above our own and above the acquisition of many regions.

Richard the Lionheart was the third son of Henry II of England and Eleanor of Aquitaine and was not destined to be king. However, all his brothers predeceased his father except for the youngest, John. He was crowned King of England at Westminster Abbey on September 3, 1189. Generally, Richard I is better known by his epithets, Richard the Lionheart and Richard Cœur de Lion, than his regnal number, having

earned that name because of his reputation as a great military leader and warrior. He remains an enduring, exemplary individual in both England and France as he beautifully exemplified the ideals of his age.

His mother, Eleanor of Aquitaine (c.1122 - April 1, 1204) was a powerful and wealthy woman in her own right during the High Middle Ages as the Duchess of Aquitaine (1137-1204), Queen Consort of Louis VII of France (1137-1152) and Queen Consort of Henry II of England (1152 - 1189). From both marriages she produced 9 children. She, her husband (King Henry II of England), and Richard the Lionheart, are buried at Fontevraud Abbey, France.

Richard the Lionheart was married to Berengaria of Navarre, daughter of Sancho VI of Navarre and his wife, Sancha of Castille, in the chapel of St. George, Limassol, Cyprus. It was an arranged marriage for political reasons, and they did not spend much time together as husband and wife since Richard was always at war. Berengaria did accompany Richard on his Third Crusade to the Holy Land. They had no children, and Richard was succeeded by his younger brother, John (1166-1216, reign 1199-1216). Toward the end of John's reign there was a revolt by the major landowners and John was forced to sign the *Magna Carta Libertatum* (commonly called the *Magna Carta*), an early step in the creation of constitutional government.

As King of England, Richard spent very little time in England, about 6 months during his 10 year reign (September 3, 1189-April 6, 1199). After spending his childhood in England, he spent most of his adult life in the Duchy of Aquitaine, on Crusade, in captivity or actively defending his lands in France. Richard I was ethnically and culturally French. His father's power was in Anjou and Normandy, and his mother was heiress to Aquitaine. When England was added to these possessions, the family's dominions ranged from the Scottish border to the Pyrenees, including a large portion of modern day France. Other than a source of revenue, Richard I was not particularly interested in England.

Richard's constant companions were knights from the Order of Knights Templar who participated in his Crusade to recover Jerusalem lost to the Saracens. The Knights Templar were formally under the control of the Order of Sion created a half century earlier by Godfroi de Bouillon. In 1187 a formal separation came between the Order of Sion and the Knights Templar which was marked by a ceremony at Gisors, France, referred to as the "cutting of the elm." From 1188 onward the Knights Templar operated autonomously until their "grim doom" in 1307 at the hands of King Philip IV of France and Pope Clement V, born Raymond Bertrand de Got, a Frenchman, who reigned from Avignon, France. Rumor has it that Richard remained protective of the Templars and consequently is by some regarded, along with the Templars, as a forerunner to modern Freemasonry.

MASONIC MOMENT

JACQUES DE MOLAY

"Dieu vengera notre mort."

God will avenge our death.



On March 18, 1314, Jacques de Molay, the 23rd and last Grand Master of the Knights Templar (1265-1314), and three other knights were burned alive at the stake on the Île aux Juifs (Island of the Jews), also known as the Île des Templiers (Island of the Templars), Paris. (There is a commemorative plaque on the Pont Neuf bridge marking the exact place of his martyrdom.) A part of his last words was, "Let evil befall those who have wrongly condemned us. God will avenge our death." The two who were instrumental in falsely accusing de Molay and condemning him to death were dead within a year. Pope Clement V (reign, 1305-1314) died a month later, and King Philip IV of France (reign, 1285-1314) died 8 months later of a cerebral stroke.

The military order of The Poor Fellow-Soldiers of Christ and of the Temple of Solomon (*Pauperes Commilitones Christi Templique Salomonici*), also known as The Order of Solomon's Temple, more simply known as The Knights Templar or just Templars, was founded in 1118 in Jerusalem to protect pilgrims in the Holy Land after the First Crusade. After Jacques de Molay and his aides were burned at the stake, the surviving knights fled, some being absorbed by other orders. Over the centuries various groups have claimed to be descended from the Templars.

The Parchment of Chinon (Named after the Royal Fortress Chinon Castle in the Loire valley where the Great Master and other important Templars had been secretly imprisoned by King Philip IV of France.), a 1308 decision by Clement V to save the Templars and their order, was erroneously archived by the Vatican Library. The 1628 catalog entry of the 40" wide parchment was "too spartan, too vague" causing its misfiling. According to the Vatican archives website, the parchment shows that Clement V was going to absolve the Templar leaders of heresy, but he would find them guilty of immorality, and planned on reforming the order. However, King Philip IV of France pressured Clement V to reverse his decision and suppressed the order in 1312.

700 years later, on October 9, 2007, the Vatican officially exonerated the Knights Templar of heresy. The minutes of the trials against the Knights Templar in 1308 were lost until their rediscovery in 2001 and were published by the Vatican Secret Archives at the end of October 2007. The 300 page volume of 799 numbered copies, *Processus Contra Templarios* in Latin, are destined for top libraries and medieval scholars at a cost of 5,900 euros per copy. (\$8,377 from the Scrinium Publishing House, which prints documents from the Vatican's Secret Archives.) The 800th copy was given to Pope Benedict XVI.

The last three paragraphs are printed in part, with addenda, from *CBS News* (printed copy), October 12, 2007, and *Trib Live*, October 13, 2007.

THE LAST TEMPLAR: THE PROPHETIC FINAL WORDS OF GRAND MASTER JACQUES DE MOLAY

For centuries the Knights Templar were one of the wealthiest and most powerful international organizations in Europe. Beginning as a small group of knights that banded together to protect Christian pilgrims on their way to the Holy Land after the First Crusade, they eventually grew into the world's first multinational corporation. Their services expanded to a wide range of activities, including international banking, with travelers' cheques being issued to pilgrims in Europe to be redeemed in Jerusalem – a much safer way to carry money across the long journey.

They had also had a large army. At their height, Templar Knights were present across Europe, Africa and the Middle East, and even had their own navy. During the 12th and 13th centuries, they were Europe's premier financial and military power. However, all of this began to decline at the Horns of Hattin in 1187,

when Saladin – the first sultan of Egypt and Syria – annihilated the Templar army and took Jerusalem out of the hands of Christian forces. After that, it was a slow decline. The Knights Templar spent more than a hundred years trying to retake the Holy Land. However, they could not permanently regain it, and with that they started to lose their reason for being in the eyes of many.

Some started to question why this rich organization was being given so many privileges. Not only did the Templars operate banks, vineyards and other businesses tax-free, they also enjoyed unrestricted mobility of their armies across Christian Princes' borders. By the beginning of the fourteenth century, the Knights Templar even contemplated forming its own monastic state, much like what had been done in Prussia and Rhodes.

Whilst many were unhappy with the knights' wealth and power, it would take more than petty grumbling for change to happen. A powerful organization could only be felled by a powerful enemy. And, as bankers of Europe, they had many disgruntled clients who could become such an adversary. King Philip IV of France was heavily indebted to the Templars. King Philip IV had used large sums of borrowed money to fight the English, and now that he no longer needed the army, he began to scheme a way of getting rid of the Templars. Luckily for him, he was in a particularly fortunate scenario, for the Pope was living with his court in Avignon under his dominion. Not only that, but Pope Clement V was also his relative. Able to pressure the Pope to act in his favor, Philip engineered the spreading of rumors about the Templars. By the early fourteenth century, it was whispered that the knights committed nefarious and lascivious acts during their ceremonies.

On Friday 13th October 1307, Phillip staged a massive, coordinated strike against the Templars. Scores of Templar knights were arrested. On 22nd November, the Pope followed suit and instituted a Papal bull that gave every monarch free reign to arrest the Templars and seize all their assets. Over the next several years, Templars were burned at the stake for unsubstantiated claims and were eventually entirely dissolved.

When their defiant Grand Master Jacques de Molay met the flames in 1314, with his hands tied together in prayer, contemporary records reported his final words as prophecy,

God knows who is wrong and has sinned. Soon a calamity will occur to those who have condemned us to death. God will avenge our death. Do not be mistaken, those who are against us will suffer because of us. I beg you to turn my face toward the Virgin Mary, from whom is born our Lord Christ. (Quote recorded in French by Geoffroi de Paris, French chronicler who died c. 1320.)

A month later, Pope Clement died and by the end of year King Philip of France was also dead.

In the Middle Ages (5th-late 15th century) individuals did not use surnames, especially in small villages where everyone knew each other. Thus, Jacques de Molay translates as "Jack from Molay", a small French town in France, 150 miles east of Paris. To this day, Molay remains a small village with a population of 66 (January 2018).

* * :

Templar, in modern English, is derived from the Old French word templier (c.1200) meaning "of or relating to a temple" derived from Medieval Latin, templarius, which is turn derived from the original Latin, templum (temple, shrine, holy pace). Templar was used by the knights because their building was headquartered on the Temple Mount in Jerusalem.

The Templars' motto was: Non Nobis Domine, Non Nobis, Sed Nomini Tuo Da Gloriam - Not In Our Name

Lord, Not In Our Name, But In The Name Of Your Glory.

The Red Cross or Cross Pattée on the Templars' mantles is a symbol of their willingness to shed their blood in sacrifice for God.

* * *

Some theorize Friday 13th is believed by many to be an unlucky day because it was on that day and date all the Templars were arrested and many were eventually killed.

* * *

DeMolay International, an international fraternal organization for young men ages 12 to 21, is named after the last Grand master of the Knights Templar, Jacques de Molay. It was founded in 1919 by Frank Sherman Land and is headquartered in Kansas City, Missouri, with a membership of just about 16,000 worldwide. Each chapter of DeMolay International must be sponsored by a local Masonic body or some other group composed exclusively of Masons. The sponsoring body is responsible for providing adult supervision and a place to meet.

A young man who joins DeMolay International serves God, honors all womanhood, loves and honors his parents, is honest, is loyal to ideals and friends, practices honest toil, his word is his bond, is clean in mind and body, unswervingly supports public schools, bears the reputation of a good, law-abiding citizen, and by precept and example preserves the high standards to which he has pledged himself.
